

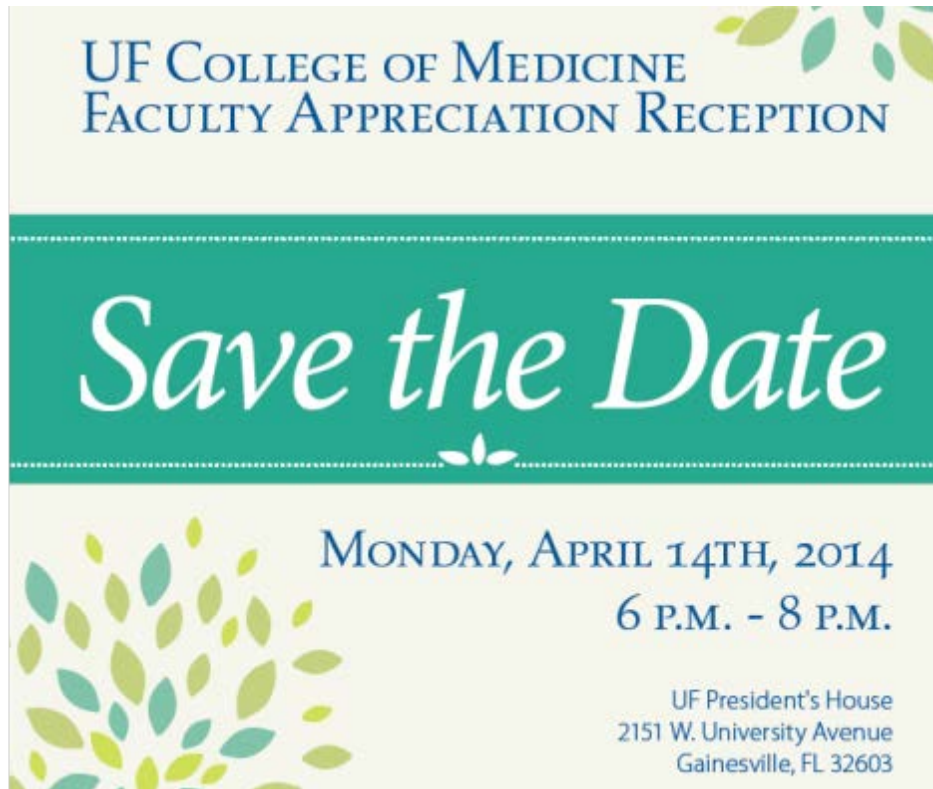

Call for Nominations: David A. Paulus, MD 2014 Award for Clinical Excellence

Nominations are being accepted for the David A. Paulus Award for Clinical Excellence. The Paulus Award is given annually to a member of the faculty of the College of Medicine who best demonstrates the ideals of clinical excellence manifested by Dr. David Paulus' legacy of making a difference for patient care. His high standards included an unfailing moral compass, engagement at every level of patient care, and championing teamwork. Dr. Paulus lived and taught these ideals throughout his career.

Nominator Eligibility:

- Currently employed UF COM faculty member with a clinical assignment. Residents and fellows may co-nominate with a UF COM faculty member.

Nominee Eligibility:

- Currently employed UF COM faculty member (Gainesville) with a clinical assignment in patient care (does not include voluntary faculty or courtesy faculty).
- Primary appointment in a UF COM clinical department.
- Member of the COM faculty for at least five years.
- Clinical achievements prompting the nomination have taken place while a UF COM faculty member.
- Clinical achievements include directly providing clinical care or directly participating in clinical services.

The award will consist of a cash prize, a plaque and listing permanent display in the COM. The awardee will be selected by a committee of 3 clinical members of Faculty Council plus Dr. Timothy Flynn, Chief Medical Officer for UF Health Shands, Dr. Marvin Dewar Chief Medical Officer for University of Florida Physicians, and Edward Jimenez, Chief Operating Officer for UF Health Shands. The winner will be announced at Faculty Appreciation Day, April 14, 2013.

Criteria for selection include (but are not limited to) documentation of:

- Local, regional and national reputation for medical expertise and clinical excellence.
- Advocacy, devotion and compassion for patients.
- Collegiality and respect for peers, referring physicians and clinical staff.

- Leading effective change in local, regional or national health care practices.
- Leadership positions in professional societies.
- Leadership positions with clinically-oriented governmental and private agencies (e.g. AHRQ, American Heart Association, American Cancer Society, etc.).
- Clinically oriented peer-reviewed publications.

Internal Deadline: NIH Shared Instrumentation Grant

The NIH Office of Research Infrastructure Programs (ORIP) has issued its annual call for proposals for Shared Instrumentation Grants (SIG), which provide funding for shared-use research instrumentation costing more than \$100,000. The maximum NIH award is \$600,000. Guidelines for the 2014 SIG program are available at <http://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/pa-files/PAR-14-073.html>. Applications must identify three or more major users who are principal investigators on NIH peer-reviewed research grants (R01, P01, U01, R35, R37, DP1 or DP2) at the time of application and award. If you are interested in submitting a SIG application, please submit the following to Karen Pastos (pastos@ufl.edu) by **Thursday, February 6th, 2014**.

- Name of principal investigator.
- Name and model of instrumentation.
- Proposed location of instrument (if other than PI lab).
- List of NIH-funded investigators who will be the main users.

New – UF Entrepreneurship Faculty Fellow Program

A new UF program seeks full-time UF faculty members, including those from all disciplines and academic areas on the campus for a collaborative program to support academic entrepreneurs. Faculty interested in integrating an entrepreneurial mindset and related concepts, tools, and frameworks into their home discipline; particularly into their research, teaching, or outreach activities are encouraged to apply. Fellows meet together monthly with entrepreneurship faculty and participate in an annual forum featuring the activities of the fellows. A small amount of funding is available to reimburse faculty for implementing some aspects of their project. There is no salary support. Those accepted into the program will be jointly appointed to the Center for Entrepreneurship and Innovation in the Warrington College of Business Administration. Applications for the inaugural class of Fellows are **due February 15, 2014**.

Last Call for Applications Macy Faculty Scholars Program

The College of Medicine may nominate one candidate to apply for the Macy Faculty Scholars program which provides \$100,000 salary (plus fringe) per year for two years to pursue educational innovations and participate in career development opportunities through national meetings and other Macy Foundation activities.

This is a competitive process with five faculty awards funded nationally each year. Eligible candidates must:

- Be a doctorally prepared faculty member in good standing at the sponsoring school;
- Have served for five or more years as a faculty member, ideally at the sponsoring school of nursing or medicine;
- Have an identified faculty mentor who will provide advice on the candidate's project and career development;

- Have an educational innovation project with the appropriate institutional support;
- Have an institutional commitment for the protection of at least 50% of time; and
- Be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States or its territories.
