The new heart and vascular and neuromedicine hospitals will be located east of the UF Health Shands Cancer Hospital. They will offer 216 beds, including 120 ICU beds and 20 state-of-the-art ORs; and the site will include a new 600-space parking garage for patients and visitors. Construction will cost approximately \$415 million and the hospitals will open in 2018.

Faculty Enhancement Opportunity Awards – For Full-Time and Part-Time Faculty

For the first time, part-time faculty in the College of Medicine are eligible to apply for FEO grants which will be funded by the College. Those who have had the equivalent of 3 years full-time employment (e.g. 6 years at 0.5FTE; 4 years at 0.75 FTE, etc.) are eligible. As always, full-time faculty are also eligible.

The **deadline** for submitting applications to the COM–FEO Review committee is **Wednesday, February 18 2015 at 5:00 pm.**

Note: COM applicants must submit a Letter of Intent to the Chair of the Review Committee, Dr. David Quillen at quillen@ufl.edu. A one line email is sufficient.

David Nelson, MD has received the 2014 Champion Award from the AAMC Learning Health System Research Award Program. The **Consent2Share** program allows patients, at the point of care (clinic, testing site, hospital, etc.) to consent to be re-contacted for future research studies in which they may be eligible to participate. Consent2Share was developed by the Clinical and Translational Research Institute (CTSI) and led by the Chair

of the UF IRB and Director of the Integrated Data Repository. Data from those consenting are loaded into the i2b2 program that allows researchers to query for the number of patients who may be eligible for particular research studies. As of September 2014, over 17,000 patients have enrolled in Consent2Share. Learn more about the program at: <http://www.ctsi.ufl.edu/research-initiatives/projects/uf-consent2share/>.
