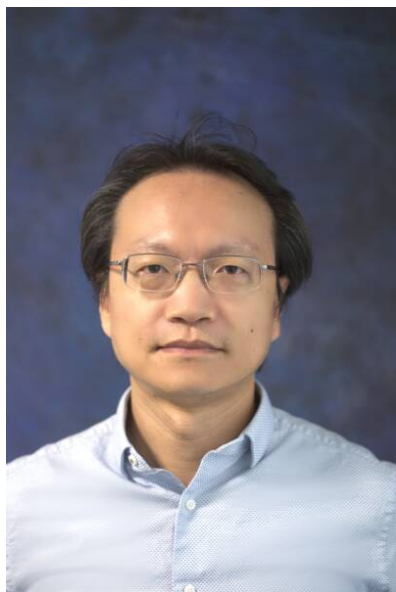

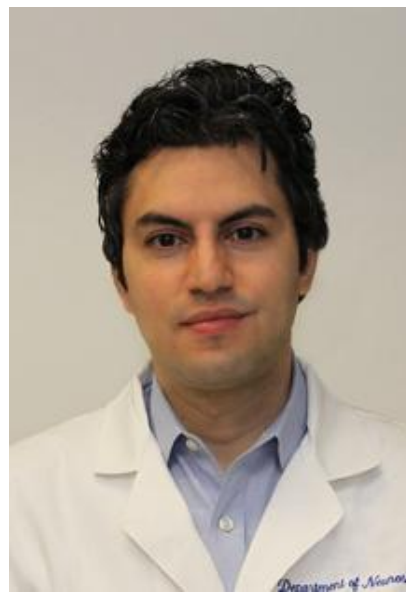

It was founded by Doug Altman many years ago, and it serves as both a database of reporting guidelines (both those created using best practices and not), an educational group (they teach a wonderful class called the EQUATOR Publication School, which all early career researchers would benefit from), and also a research group. ### **Best Practices in Data Management**

*Thursday, March 11, 12-1pm*

Learn practical strategies for best managing your research data. Several U.S. funding agencies such as the National Science Foundation and the National Institutes of Health require researchers to supply plans for managing research data, called Data Management Plans (DMP), for all new grant proposals. This workshop will provide an overview of the questions to consider when creating a data management plan, with a focus on the DMPTool and tools for sharing your data at the University of Florida (e.g., subject-specific repositories). Topics include metadata and annotation, file formats and organization, storage, backups and security, and data sharing. The workshop is geared toward graduate students, faculty, and researchers.

### **Data Cleaning with OpenRefine**

OpenRefine (formerly Google Refine) is a powerful free and open-source tool for data cleaning, enabling you to correct errors in the data, and make sure that the values and formatting are consistent. In addition, OpenRefine records your processing steps, enabling you to apply the

same cleaning procedure to other data, and enhancing the reproducibility of your analysis. This workshop will teach you to use OpenRefine to clean and format data and automatically track any changes that you make.

### **Using GitHub for Collaboration**

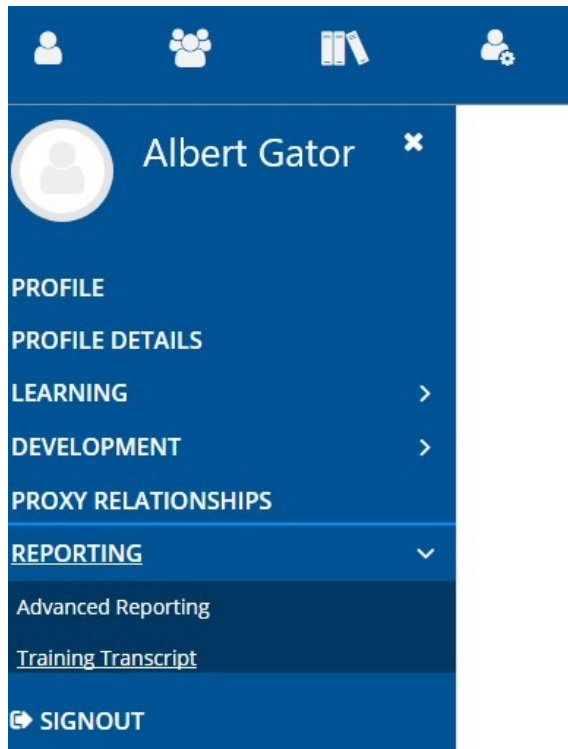
*Tuesday, March 16 12-1pm*
