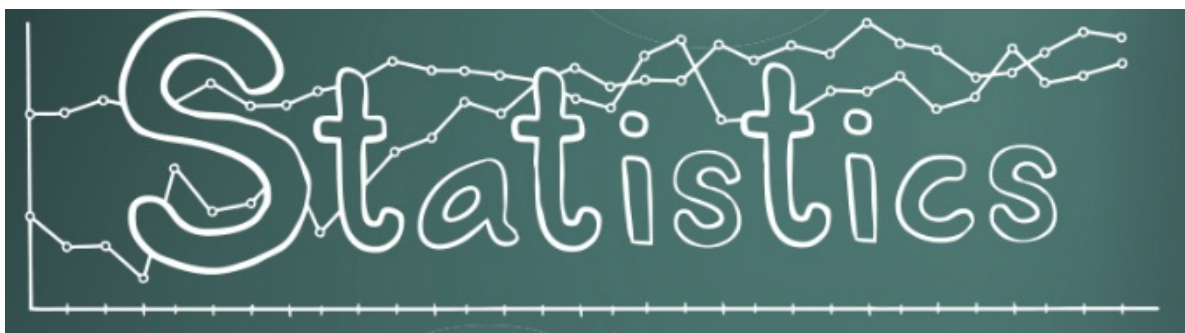

On behalf of Drs. Lyle Moldawer and Philip Efron, the College of Medicine Office of Research is sharing this announcement of the funding opportunity for the Biomedical Research Collective (BRC): Enhancing the Interdisciplinary Approach to Scientific Inquiry.

The Sepsis and Critical Illness Research Center (SCIRC) in the Department of Surgery at the UF College of Medicine is seeking applications for innovative, interdisciplinary pilot programs which address the short- and long-term consequences of critical illness. The purpose of this program is to provide pilot grants, core resources, and mentoring, as well as to foster a collaborative community, all which will support research which advances outcomes in sepsis, severe trauma, burns and critical illness. The pilot program aims to support Junior or early stage investigator (ESIs) and their pursuit of external funding by providing transitional financial and infrastructure support through a partnership with the SCIRC.

We expect to award up to two pilot grants in the first year of this program. The requested budget should reflect the scope of the proposed research. Matching funds from other sources to support the work are encouraged. Total budget costs may be budgeted for one- or two-year projects. Funding for basic or translational science studies is capped at \$100K, and clinical studies are capped at \$150K. Applications for pilot studies follow the standard format of NIH applications (SF424).

- **Letter of Intent Due: December 1, 2022 (*the letter of intent is required*)**
- **Full Application Due upon invitation: March 1, 2023(*required*)**.
- **Funding date: July 1, 2023.**

2023 MSRP Call for Project Descriptions

UF Faculty,

As described on the Discovery Pathways Program and Medical Student Research Program (MSRP) web page: <http://discovery.education.med.ufl.edu/msrp/>, medical students will conduct research for approximately 10 weeks under the mentorship of faculty members during the 2023 summer break between their first and second year. Students will enroll in a medical elective course and receive academic credit and a scholarship of at least \$2,000.

The number of students participating in the summer research program grows yearly. Over 120 medical students participated in the 2022 MSRP, and we anticipate that an equal number of students will participate in the 2023 MSRP. Students will apply to the program this starting in December, and we hope to develop a robust list of projects to support this ongoing initiative.

To offset the workload required of invested mentorship, participating faculty will receive 4 educational RVUs per student per week. Each department manages eRVUs, so how this ultimately impacts your assigned effort will depend on the current educational policy within your department.

As they are received, projects will be listed on the MSRP web page and available for students to begin their search. Any research project that involves “discovery” or “scholarship” on a topic related to the broad mission of the College of Medicine is appropriate for the MSRP. Projects focused on quality or patient safety would also be appropriate for the program. Please take a few minutes and generate a brief description of any research project(s) that you will have available next summer (June to August 2023). We ask that you complete the web form (<https://discovery.education.med.ufl.edu/msrp/2016-msrp-application-forms/faculty-project-description-form/>) no later than **December 1, 2022**. An example of a short project description is attached for your convenience. To ensure consistency, we will only be able to accept your project description via the online form linked above.

We look forward to having you as a mentor. Thank you for providing research opportunities for our medical students!
